## Legal Description:

Report of Survey

Research of the records of McPherson County revealed the following information:

Roads: Road on the East side of section 27, T17S-R3W, right of way 33.00' on each side of section line. Road right of way area on the West side of parcel computes to be 0.25 acre.

<u>Surveys:</u> G.L.O. survey of Section 27, T17S-R3W by Elisha Diefendorf, dated November 7-12, 1864. Surveys in Section 27, T17S-R3W by Forgy-Allen, for Ralph A. Thorstenberg, dated 1983. References for section corners found at the McPherson County Public Works vault.

Field Procedure: I searched for the following monuments: The East 1/4 Corner, the Southeast Corner, the South 1/4 Corner, the Southwest Corner, the West 1/4 Corner, and the North 1/4 Corner of section 27, T17S-R3W and found the East 1/4 Corner, the Southeast Corner, the Southwest Corner, the West 1/4 Corner, and the North 1/4 corner of said Section 27 in good condition. I sampled the physical evidence of said section and determined the position of the South 1/4 Corner from the original G.L.O. survey. The South 1/4 Corner was set by single proportion between the Southwest corner and the Southeast corner. I used a Nikon DTM-522 total station to read distances and turn angles. I set 1/2" x 24" rebars with plastic I.D. caps at the section corners I monumented. I set 1/2"x 24" rebars with I.D. caps at the property pins I monumented.
